

On Sunday, April 29, volunteers from the entire Saint Mark family banded together in an effort to provide life-saving nutrition to thousands of local malnourished children. Over one hundred volunteers stayed after Liturgy to help pack 20,000 meals in our Fellowship Hall. Included below is a first-hand recap from one of our volunteers, James Constantine.

What a great day at Saint Mark! It began with a beautiful Divine Liturgy officiated by His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios (who delivered a powerful and passionate sermon), and ended with more than 100 parishioners assembling 20,000 meals for the hungry. The event was a remarkable opportunity for community service, and gave our parish a tangible way to make a significant difference here in South Florida. The event was made possible thanks to our partner “Feeding Children Everywhere,” who provided the materials, training, and then organized the distribution of the meals through Boca Helping Hands.

We also must thank our own Frank Rekas, who acted as the chairperson for the event. His incredible work and devotion helped make this amazing day possible for all of us, and most importantly, all of the children who will benefit from these meal packages.

After the hour-and-a-half of packing, all of



our volunteers were treated to some of Boca Raton’s finest Pizza from Renzo’s along with some great fellowship. I couldn’t help but notice the satisfied expression on the faces of all of our volunteers as they were enjoying the pizza after a morning of service to others. Their content faces were not a result of the pizza (though it was delicious), but in the realization that so many thousands of children will have full bellies thanks to their efforts.

On behalf of the entire Saint Mark Family, I would like to thank all who participated and contributed to help make this outreach initiative a big success!

5. Join our Prayer Ministry Team — praying for those in need



Life on earth is a gift. The work we do is also a gift if we see it as an opportunity to serve God and others. Saint Paul instructs us, “Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men...” (Colossians 3:23). When we see our work in this way, we are able to become Christian stewards of our work.

Being a steward is about becoming a good caretaker of all that God has given us. God has given each of us special and unique gifts. And through Holy Scripture He teaches us all that we have is a loan. He lends everything to us, and reminds us that one day He will ask us to give a detailed accounting of what we have done with the gifts He has given us. Archbishop Anastasios of Albania has noted that “we find ourselves by offering ourselves.” Have we learned the blessedness of generously giving to others of all we have?

That is the measure of Christian Stewardship, not giving merely an expendable portion, but giving the *best* of what we have, and who we are. We are called to give back to God from the “first fruits” of our labor. We support our parish and her ministries in an intentional way and not with only what is left after everything else has been taken care of.

THE FEAST OF PENTECOST

“It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Comforter will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you.”

The eternal the Son of God, Jesus Christ becomes incarnate for our salvation to restore us once again to the pre-fallen state in Eden. We recently relived these saving events which brought these about; the Lord’s Crucifixion, His Passion and His glorious Resurrections.

The Lord’s promise of sending the Comforter is realized on Pentecost Day. On this day, the Holy Spirit descends on the apostles and the Church is established. The Church is given its essence, the real presence of God by the Holy Spirit, which transforms the disciples from fishermen to fishers of people, drawing all who believe into the nets of the Church.

The Holy Spirit, the third person of the Holy Trinity, continues the work of Christ by enabling and empowering the disciples and the clergy through the centuries to lead all people to salvation. The New Adam, Christ, replaces the old Adam. We are no longer subjected to the desires of the flesh, as was with the old Adam, but in Christ we are able to soar to the heavens and participate in the life of Eden, life in Paradise once again. At Pentecost the new age and a new creation begins for all believers.

We no longer walk in the darkness of evil and ignorance as we did after the Fall, but in the light of God. We belong not only to this world, but simultaneously to the heavenly. Human nature is exalted, for the Lord resurrects our human body to a new spiritual body and places it on the right hand of the Father together with his own body.

The Holy Spirit now is man’s companion, giving him the strength to free himself from the bondage of evil and to live in the Lord. All believers are once again found in God’s favor as they were before the Fall in the Garden Eden.

The Holy Spirit, received at Chrismation, grants us the gifts or fruit of the Spirit. “The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.” (Galatians 5:22-23) These beautiful gifts are ours. What great comfort the Comforter bestows on us!

Love is given first place in the gallery of God’s gifts. Like beautiful pictures, they offer beauty to the soul they adorn. Love is considered the root of all Christian virtues. All virtues are nourished by love. If the root is cut from a tree, the tree will die. If the root of God’s love is lacking from our soul, then all virtues are in danger of dying within us.

Love is God working in us drawing us closer to himself. It takes two people to love. God offers love and we receive it as a gift and in turn we offer love to the Lord and to others. Love reconciles the estranged, makes the unbelievers believers, the indifferent enthusiastic, the anxious meek and the proud humble. To love and not be transformed or transforming is not to love at all.

The joyous message of Pentecost is that God’s love is among us through the Holy Spirit. Through the Holy Spirit, “Christ is among us, he is and shall always be” now and for all eternity. As the Saint Mark parish, the love of Christ binds us together into his Body, the Church. As we grow in our love for Christ, we grow also in our love for each other.

“If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit!”

PHILOPTOCHOS - NIKI CORE

On February 12 we celebrated our Valentine Membership Event, organized by Mary Gagliardi, at the Boca Bath and Tennis Clubhouse. Over 75 ladies shared an afternoon of delicious food and friendship, as well as an informative program about Philoptochos presented by Anita Kartalopoulos, a member of the National Board. If you have not done so already, please fill out a membership form to update our records and volunteer your talents. All membership dues should be paid before April 30 so we can send in our results to National. We already have 23 new members and are hoping to surpass the 200+ members we had last year. The first Lenten dinner, prepared by Assimo Kitsos and Philoptochos volunteers, served 120 people - a wonderful *start* to our Lenten journey. We also once again sold dyed eggs and tsoureki before and during Holy Week, provided the flowers for the Epitaphio, and assisted with the Anastasi dinner, which was a beautiful way to share the *end* of our journey with family and friends.



During our March General Meeting, we had a special presentation by Thelma Sorrentino, who has helped prepare koliva for our parishioners for many years. She explained the meaning of this tradition in the Orthodox faith and walked us through the process step by step. In May 2017 our Philoptochos chapter awarded \$4,000 in scholarships to our high school graduates. This year we have an unusually high number of seniors and were blessed to help support those who applied.

Last year we applied for our 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status, and we were pleased to receive notification in February that our request had been granted. In addition to donors being able to deduct their contributions, we are also qualified to receive tax-deductible bequests, devises, transfers and gifts. We would like to thank Maria Spiliopoulos and Harry Mirabile for their assistance in helping us with this important project.

During the month of March, all Philoptochos chapters send in a donation for Hellenic College Holy Cross (HCHC). In their recent newsletter there was a special article acknowledging Philoptochos and their special relationship with the school. Philoptochos now has 26,000 members in 440 chapters, each of which raises funds for HCHC twice a year. “To date, Philoptochos has given over \$3.7 million to our school for everything from scholarships to technological improvements...
