My Dear Faithful,

Have you ever felt so overwhelmed, so discouraged, so hopeless, that you didn't know what to do? Have you ever felt like the world was crashing down on you? Whether it's issues with co-workers or family . . . whether it's illness or chronic pain . . . whether it's watching your child make the same mistake over and over again. . . whether it's that "difficult" talk you know you have to have with a friend. These overwhelming, daunting feelings can lead to deep dark discouragement.

So how do we climb out of the pit? At the beginning of the 20th century, Thomas Edison was working to develop a battery capable of powering an automobile. Things were not going well. The genius inventor had tried 10,000 experiments. All of them had failed!

Most people would be demoralized. Not Edison. His famous line sums up his determination, "I have not failed, I've just found 10,000 ways that won't work."

Edison is the kind of person I want on my team when the chips are down. That's the kind of optimism that we need in this life.

Another great example is King David. If Edison could see the silver lining in the depressing cloud, David knew the secret to soaring above it. David was seventy years old and ready to retire. After forty years on Israel's throne, it was time to pass the leadership baton to his son, Solomon, and his task was daunting:

- Who was he to fill the shoes of Israel's greatest leader since Moses?
- Who was he to pick up the harp of the great psalmist?
- Who was he to follow the man who was "a man after God's own heart"?
- And who was he to bring to life David's dream of building a temple for God?

Solomon was overwhelmed and scared . . . but King David's words to him were quite powerful: "Be strong and courageous, and do the work. Don't be afraid or discouraged by the size of the task, for the LORD God, my God, is with you. He will not fail you or forsake you." (1 Chronicles 28:20)

God is your ladder out of the pit of discouragement and despair. That is what David reminded Solomon: "My God—the one who dropped Goliath, scattered enemies, and brought hope to a discouraged heart—is with you. He will not fail you or forsake you."

If you want to overcome the difficulties in life – the reality is that you can't do it alone – only with the Lord on your side. If you turn your life over to God, He will raise you out of that pit of pain, discouragement, isolation and sickness.

Come before God. Name your daunting task. Identify your frustrating challenge. Get "real" with your relationship to Him and about your discouraged heart. Then praise him and lean on him. He is your ever-present help. He will not fail you or forsake you.

'WHAT SAINT MARK MEANS TO ME" – KATHI KARAGEORGES-SHARP

What does Saint Mark mean to me? In a word, Love.

My husband and I have been members here at Saint Mark since around 1991. It was actually the festival that brought us here...I say this because I was not an active member but at my core, I wanted to be more involved in my church and my faith. I had to change my actions, not just my thoughts. It was a process.

The festival not only brought us to Saint Mark but it brought the gift of Denise and Steve Alman into our lives. You see, I was getting my teeth cleaned by a beautiful Greek dental hygienist- Denise. During my appointment, we made plans to go to the Greek festival together. That night, the four of us met at the festival and it changed us forever.

Still, when I came to church, it was intimidating. I did not (and still do not) understand many of the sacraments of our beautiful faith and I could not explain any of it to my husband Tim (who grew up in the Lutheran denomination).

Fast forward to our daughter Kara's birth and baptism...Tim consequently decided to convert because he wanted to receive communion with Kara. We became God parents to four babies and, of course, Tim was chrismated. Now God presented us with real ties and responsibilities to our extended family. Over time, we became more involved with various ministries at different levels. Additionally, we had losses - my mom first in 2006 followed in 2011, 12 and 13 with the losses of Tim's dad, mom and my dad in that order. Our beloved Saint Mark family was there for us. Thank you all for that.

We have so many friends here now-and we continue to deepen these relationships and make new friends. When I come to church now, I feel love, not intimidation. I still do not know all of the sacraments but I do know that I am filled with love- to give and to receive when I am here. And I know that at the core of each of us, we all want the same thing- to be loving and to be loved-especially when we are among our Saint Mark family.

I have experienced it at Costco, in airports, schools, and the mall- when we see each other in these places, we reach out to each other- we are not strangers looking away but instead, we try to make a connection to each other, anchored through our shared belonging to Saint Mark.And I have seen it here at Saint Mark with strangers. I have a beautiful story of our Saint Mark family taking care of one another.

A few weeks ago, I was coming to church. In the parking lot, I saw someone holding a huge umbrella and several people around Ida, who had fallen. None of these people knew her but Gino was here ushering and someone notified him. He was coming out to see how she was, 911 had already been called, someone was holding ice on her wrist and was attending to her and, of course, the umbrella was shading her from the intense heat of the sun that morning. I happen to know the people in this scenario-from all walks of life- all ages- all good Samaritans coming to the aid of a parishioner trying to come to church. (For her son's memorial no less, which of course, none of them knew). She did not get to church that day, she left in an ambulance with Gino for the hospital. She has since had surgery to repair her broken wrist.

The situation brings tears to my eyes for what happened to Ida, especially under the circumstances of her trying to honor her departed and beloved son. However, the tears are a mixture of sadness and joy. I witnessed something so beautiful. The actions of those who cared for Ida were pure love and compassion.

Do you feel the love that is here at Saint Mark? We are all connected. Saint John writes in his First Epistle, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God."

Our love for God has helped us to build this magnificent sanctuary. Additionally, we are blessed with outstanding leadership and ministries. Our Love of God — our stewardship to Him, reflects the offering of our blessings back to God. Everything we have and that we are is because of God and belongs to God. He works through us and it is our obligation to serve Him in everything that we do, and that is shown by our financial support in our Stewardship.

I know we all love Saint Mark. And I know that we all appreciate all that our Church is and the abundance that we receive here through worship, fellowship, ministries, outreach, and more. We cannot afford to take any of what we have here for granted. What we have did not just happen through spontaneous combustion or serendipity- it was a process to get here. Let's all be part of the process as we move forward to preserve, protect, and expand the love and the experience that is unique to our beloved Saint Mark Church.

How do we do this? WE come from our heart center and give lovingly and generously of our time, treasure, and talent- our stewardship! So, rejoice in the experience available to us at Saint Mark! Be part of the Saint Mark Family!


BOOKSTORE - YVETTE KOUTSOUPIS

This week Stewardship Committee member Kathi Sharp had the chance to sit down with Matt & Vivian Jenetopoulos in the second installation of our series of interviews spotlighting some of our Saint Mark stewards. This will be an ongoing forum in which we will be able to learn from our brothers and sisters what being an Orthodox steward means to them.

KATHI SHARP (KS): Matt, you have been an usher and a member of our Stewardship Committee for some time now, but for those who may not know you, tell us about you and your family.

tion, and due to this we have both volunteered as Sunday School teachers for over 50 years, many of which Matt served as director of the program.


