The journey of Great Lent has finally come to an end in the most glorious fashion! What began with the Lord's triumphant entry on Palm Sunday, the 2014 Holy Week reached its pinnacle on Sunday, April 20, when close to a thousand believers gathered at Saint Mark to celebrate the Resurrection of Christ. As soon as the clock struck midnight Fr. Mark emerged from the Altar, surrounded by darkness, holding a single candle proclaiming to all "Come Receive the Light!" Soon that one flame spread to hundreds of waiting candles, filling the Church (and the faithful) with a warmth and light.

Pastoral Message Reach Up to the Risen Christ



My Dear Faithful,

Christ is Risen . . . Truly He is Risen!

We exclaim this beautiful exhortation for 40 days after the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We greet each other with these words, instead of the usual "hello, how are you?" What a beautiful way to bring the resurrected Christ into our lives on a daily basis. What an amazing way to keep the resurrected Christ alive in our everyday lives for more than one evening.

One of the beautiful icons that adorn our Saint Mark Church is the icon of the Resurrection, or the Descent into Hades. At Saint Mark, this is located on the East wall to the right of the Altar (and right of the Crucifixion icon). It is most descriptive and symbolic and richly tells us the beautiful theology of the Orthodox Christian Church.

One of the most scenic elements of this icon is the depiction of Adam and Eve with their outstretched hands reaching to our Lord. And in turn, Jesus Christ, is lifting them up. We know that Adam and Eve had died many years earlier . . . their story appears in the Book of Genesis, the first Book of the Old Testament, which was written many centuries before the birth of Christ.

Our tradition tells us that after Adam and Eve were banished from the Garden of Eden for disobeying God and eating from the "tree of life," the gates of paradise were closed. For all those who died after this, Paradise was not open and all went to Hades. It wasn't until Jesus Christ died and descended into Hades, to offer "new life", that those who were suffering were offered a better way. And thus, now, we too, are offered a better way and can enter eternal life in Paradise with our Lord and Savior.

To do this, we must be like Adam and Eve and "reach up" to our Lord and Savior. We can "reach up" out of the sinfulness of the world that surrounds us and place our hands with the Risen Lord. We can "reach up" to our Lord and leave the pride, ego and ugliness of this world, and embrace the Risen Christ. We can "reach up" to Him who gave us everything, even His life.

Our Lord is extending His hand to us on a daily basis . . . He is offering us new life in Him. We must "reach up" and take hold; grasp the King of Kings, the Lord of Hosts . . . this is how we work in synergy with our Lord.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, "Reach Up" and our Lord will raise you up to be with Him. Your lives will be anew and the power of the Risen Lord will transform your lives forever.

SAINT SPOTLIGHT THE 179 MARTYRS OF DAOU PENTELIS MONASTERY

The Church of Saint Mark has received a number of blessings this year, but one of the most important (yet least understood) is the reception of the relics of the Holy 179 Martyrs of the Daou Pentelis Monastery. During our Consecration in February, a relic from these martyrs was forever sealed inside the Altar Table in our sanctuary. But few of us actually know the story of these men.

The monastery of Daou Pentelis is located near the Greek port of Rafina (20 miles west of Athens). During Holy Week in 1680, pirates in search of treasures docked their ship and tried to infiltrate the monastery but were unable to get past the walls. However, a servant of the monastery showed the pirates a secret access point allowing them undetected entry into the monastery. On Pascha, following the final "Christ is Risen," the pirates stormed the monastery, raided it of its posessions, and slaughtered the 179 monks before burning it down to the ground.

Only two monks escaped martyrdom. They were serving the Paschal liturgy in a neighboring monastery. They returned to Daou Pentelis the next day, only to find the buildings burnt and their brothers slain. They asked their neighboring monks to help them bury their brothers, and they did so following a Bright Week funeral service. These 179 martyrs are remembered every year on the Tuesday following Pascha.


Sunday after Liturgy to answer your questions and accept your donations.

PHILOPTOCHOS - PAM PARENT

The women of Philoptochos are honored to have served the community of Saint Mark since its inception. Over the years we have given of our time talent and treasure to our church and our community. This year was no exception. With the generous support of the community of Saint Mark we were able to disseminate nearly \$30,000 to our community, our church, nationally and internationally -- all in the name of Saint Mark.



At a local level we have given \$2000 in scholarships to worthy high school graduates, \$1000 in funding for our GOYANs attending St. Stephen's Camp, \$500 to the Syrtaki dancers, and a full-year tuition for one student to attend Greek School.

We also gave out over \$6,000 to Saint Mark parishioners in need. We contributed of our time talent and treasure to the Consecration, hosting the Friday night reception, making koliva for the Memorial and setting up, serving and cleaning up for each reception. Our women bake thousands of pastries for our Greek Festival.

Holy Week saw our women decorating the Kouvouklion, boiling eggs and preparing eggs for the community. All proceeds from the sale of the eggs were donated back to the church.

One of our proudest accomplishments has been the donation of the icon of Martha and Mary which adorns our Sanctuary wall. \$15,000 was raised through donations from our membership.

At the community level we donated to Boca Helping Hands, the Caring Kitchen, Orthodox Christian Network, Children's Place at Home Safe and others. We also volunteer to feed the hungry monthly at the Caring Kitchen in Delray Beach and have committed \$500 to Family Promise, a local organi-



zation that provides shelter and food to families in need.

All proceeds from our coffee hour, koliva and coffee hour sponsorships each and every week goes to worthy organizations on behalf of Saint Mark...these include: Cancer Fund, General Medical Fund, IOCC, OCMC, Social Services, St. Photios Shrine, Hellenic College/ Holy Cross Scholarship Fund, Retired Clergy Association and more.

Did you know that your koliva or coffee hour sponsorship can be directed to the Philoptochos charity of your choice?

Internationally, we have assisted the People of Greece by sending funds to help alleviate hunger. We also sent funds to the Philippines immediately after the hurricane there.

We are a vibrant and growing chapter, and have reached an all time high of nearly 150 members this year. • Love, Sexuality and the Sacrament of Marriage - Two essays on the nature of love, sexuality and marriage written from an Orthodox Christian perspective. The author then provides excerpts from the writings of the Tradition of the Christian East.

• The Faith: Understanding Orthodox Christianity - This book is an excellent introduction to Orthodoxy for anyone Orthodox or otherwise. The author explains clearly and concisely what the trinity is and why it's so important to Christians, the Fall of Mankind, Fervent Intercessors, what a Saint is and is not, the teachings of Christ, the Birth and Mission of the Church, Missions and Evangelism, Holy Baptism, the Seal of the Gift of the Holy Spirit, the Mystical Supper, etc.

• *Beginning to Pray* - Easy to read, yet it contains so much theological depth that it is truly amazing. The real meat begins in Chapter One, "The Absence of God" where Bloom writes, "If you look at the relationship (us and God) in terms of mutual relationship, you would see that God could complain about us a great deal more than we about Him. We complain that He does make Himself present to us for a few minutes we reserve for Him, but what about the twenty-three and half hours during which God may be knocking at our door and we answer 'I am busy...!"

As well as these new additions, a "must-have" in any personal library is *My Daily Orthodox Prayer Book* for only \$10.00. This is widely viewed as one of the BEST prayer books offered by the Orthodox Church. We also have books for children and young adults, mothers to be, women, abd men, in general, facing issues in today's society.
